VA Stand Down

The VA stand down was organized by community affairs chairs Annie Bui and Katherine Wu and precepted by Dr. Timothy Chen. From June 29th to July 1st, CSHP-UCSD partnered with the local VA for the annual VA Stand Down. This 3-day event focused on bringing together veterans from all over the San Diego area who battle with homelessness, poverty, unemployment, and lack of access to proper healthcare. In an effort to help these veterans reclaim their lives, the Stand Down provided food, clothing, shelter, and health screenings in addition to services related to legal, employment, and housing solutions. Student volunteers helped medical triage and pharmacy tents alongside several nurses and pharmacists. Volunteers at the medical tent performed medication reconciliation. In the pharmacy volunteers helped with medication dispensing and patient consultations.



CSHP Penny Wars/Pie Day

Poison Prevention

Our poison prevention chair Connie Ma hosted a lunchtime talk on October 31st, 2018 with guest speaker Dr. Cantrell. Dr. Cantrell, who works at the Poison Control Center, shared about what he does as a pharmacist and medication expert to help accidental poisonings. He talked about how he ended up at his current position, a typical day on the job, and common questions they receive. He shared about his research with outdated medications to determine its potential toxicity and potency (such as opioids that are expired by 70 years!) and his research with tide pods. Thank you to those who attended-we had a great turn out with 70 students!

Connie Ma also held a Poison Prevention Parents Meeting on November 24th, 2018 at the City Heights Library. Every year, CSHP partners with Head Start, which is an elementary school program catered to lower-income backgrounds. Tran Bui and Connie Ma presented to around 17 parents with young children regarding what to do in the case of an emergency, how to keep the home safe from accidental poisonings, and common accidents that occur. The parents were interactive, shared anecdotes, and asked a lot of guestions. Thank you to our Tran Bui for helping out in this event!

The CSC is an annual competition where students in teams of two are handed a patient case and provide MTM and other healthcare recommendations in an organized oral presentation and Pharmacy Care Plan. Student teams have two hours to work up their patients before giving a 2 minute oral presentation followed by 8 minutes of Q&A from the judges. Judges then score their overall performance based upon specific parameters. The winners of this competition get their registration fee and board paid for by the school at the CSHP Seminar where they will compete with other schools. This year was a close competition and all the teams were well prepared for the cases, but the winners did stand out to the judges. This years winners were Yuna Kim and Samantha Kim. Legislative Day 2018

Skaggs Legislative Day was held on October 20th, 2018 and was a co-hosted event with CSHP's Legislative Current Affairs Chair Maher Alhaja with APhA-ASP/CPhA. Legislative Day is an annual event where pre-pharmacy students, current pharmacy students and pharmacists/pharmacy technicians come to hear about current legislation. Legislative Day 2018 speakers were: James Colbert PharmD, FASHP, FCSHP: he gave an introduction about the origin of the profession of pharmacy and how the profession has changed over the years with the power of advocacy. Anthony Pedalino, PharmD, SDSHP President: He presented about the recent legislation and the current bills that CSHP and CPhA are advocating for. Steven Thompson, PharmD, CSHP President: He presented to the students about how his journey in advocacy began until he became the CSHP president. He is also discussed the importance of networking in pharmacy. Aaron Byzak, MBA, FACHE, Chief Government Relations and External Affairs Manager: He discussed the importance of advocacy and how he was inspired with the idea of the San Diego Prescription Drug Abuse Task Force based on real stories of drugs abuse. Daniel Martinez, BA, CPhA Governmental Relations and External Affairs Manager: discussed recent bills that CPhA are supporting and the importance of advocacy to advance the profession.





PRYDE Outreach

PRYDE (Prevention, Recreation, Youth, Diversity, and Education) is an afterschool program the YMCA established to empower students through education and guidance. On December 4th, 2018, CSHP volunteers had the opportunity to teach middle school students about asthma. The outreach started with a presentation about asthma symptoms, triggers, and treatment options. To visually demonstrate how asthma narrows the airways and affects breathing, they incorporated a simulation that required students to race and blow balloons using straws (representing airways) of different diameters. Students additionally had the chance to practice using MDI and diskus inhalers following a brief demo from our volunteers. The remainder of the outreach involved a fun and competitive game of LUNGO (asthma-themed BINGO) to review all of the topics covered.



CSHP & PILL'S Residency Showcase

The Residency & Fellowship Showcase was co-hosted by our Professional Affairs chair Thuy Nguyen with PILL and held on September 25th, 2018. The showcase was an opportunity for students to interact and get to know various residency and fellowship programs. It was an excellent opportunity to network with residency directors, residents, and fellows and learn about what each program has to offer. Approximately 100 students were in attendance. Oceanside Community Outreach

The purpose of the outreach was to educate students from grades 2-8 about tobacco and asthma awareness. The outreach consisted of an educational presentation supplemented with several interactive demos. In the tobacco awareness segment, we covered the different types of smoking tobacco (i.e. cigarettes, marijuana, vaping products), the harmful effects of smoking, and nicotine replacement therapy options. In the asthma awareness segment, we covered asthma symptoms, triggers, non-drug and drug therapies. A majority of this segment focused on inhalers, including a discussion about the difference between guick-relief and long-term control inhalers followed by demonstrations on how to properly use an MDI and Diskus inhaler. We concluded with a fun activity where students got to make their own "mucus" using glue, borax solution, and food coloring.



Welcome Back BBQ
